A Message from Dr. Ann Marie Krejcarek, President of Convent & Stuart Hall

Dear Convent & Stuart Hall Community,

Thank you for the valuable feedback you have been passing along via our SFCorConnect link. I hope you experience our team as being responsive and continuing to iterate and add value to this remote experience.

In this update, I will share our adjusted spring break schedule, how the San Francisco Public School announcement affects our school calendar, and lastly let you know about the weekly schedule for course delivery moving forward.

Spring Break

Questions about spring break may have been the most asked this week. Below is what I shared earlier today with our faculty and outlines an adjustment I have made to the break.

It is my goal to both support a teaching and learning week that is good for our students and faculty as well as to finish the school year as initially scheduled. In service of that goal, I have made the following decision on this year's spring break.

Easter Break - Adjusted Schedule

Friday, April 10 (Good Friday) - Tuesday, April 14

Classes resume on Wednesday, April 15

Our school complex will be closed during spring break from Friday, April 10 (Good Friday) through Tuesday, April 14.

With this schedule, we will be able to maintain the robust course delivery on Tuesday–Friday with Mondays as teacher preparation going forward (see below for additional, optional Monday offerings for students). We will also be able to end the year as currently scheduled. We intend these Mondays of planning and independent work to offer balance in the week for both students and faculty.

Additional Monday Offerings - ASP for K-8

For some families, the Mondays without instruction have been challenging, so we are offering an optional Virtual ASP programming during the school day on Mondays. Andrew Hoffer, our Extended Programming Director, will be sending a schedule of activities to our K–8 families via email. If you would

like to participate in ASP Mondays, please RSVP with the link in SFCorConnect. This programming is free of charge and is intended to meet the needs of our community.

San Francisco Public School Announcement

You may have heard the public school system is going to stay virtual for the remainder of the school year. I have also heard that the public school system may need to adjust the start of the school year next fall to make up required attendance days and to catch up on the curriculum.

I meet weekly with the CAIS school heads across the state. The conversation this week centered on independent schools in California making individual school decisions. To date, most independent schools have not made the decision to remain virtual through the end of the year. We will continue to be attentive and responsive to new information as it becomes available. As yet, there is not sufficient information to make a determination about our May schedule. The difference with independent schools is the size of our student body, which makes it possible for us to respond more quickly if it is deemed safe for us to return to campus this year.

I sincerely appreciate your continued partnership and I am so very proud of our students and faculty, as well as all of our Central Services team for the role they are playing.
