A Message from Dr. Ann Marie Krejcarek, President of Convent & Stuart Hall

Dear Convent & Stuart Hall Community,

I hope our students have begun to find a rhythm to their days in virtual school. I know they miss each other, but I am encouraged by the resilience and adaptability they have shown. I hope you also have found a pattern in your day that helps hold the dynamic situation we all find ourselves in these days.

As we shared when we entered this remote environment, we envisioned and prepared for distance learning to last several weeks. With Governor Newsom's announcement yesterday that the shelter-in-place will be in effect in California through the end of April, we do not anticipate that school will physically be in session until **May 4th at the earliest**. It is our hope that we will be able to be together again as a community before the end of the school year, but we will be watchful of the emerging situation. In the spirit of the school's continuing to be virtual, I invite your feedback and look forward to our continued learning and iteration to make this virtual experience the best it can be for our students. ASP support for on-campus supervision of kindergarten age and above

Since distance learning is an essential function, we have the ability to support this essential function by providing supervision for faculty and staff children. Andrew Hoffer has studied the CDC requirements and is prepared to put the protocols in place that make for the safe supervision of children. Faculty and Staff can take advantage of this for a half day, a full day, a week, or whatever supports them in their work.
